Keep away from foodstuffs, beverages and feed.
Immediately remove all soiled and contaminated clothing

When used as intended with Agilent instruments the use of the product under normal laboratory conditions and with standard practices does not result in significant airborne exposures and therefore respiratory protection is not needed.

Under an emergency condition where a respirator is deemed necessary, use a NIOSH or equivalent approved device equipment with appropriate organic or acid gas cartridge.

· Protection of hands:

Although not recommended for constant contact with the chemicals or for clean up, nitrile gloves 11-13mil thickness are recommended for normal use. The breakthrough time is 1hr.
